Asia Leadership Program participants visit Yokohama facilities

The 2017 Asia Leadership Program on Sustainable Development and Climate Change, organized by the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Ministry of the Environment, among other groups, was held from June 27 to 30.



Yokohama's Climate Change Policy Headquarters gave a presentation on sustainable urban development on June 27 at the ADB Institute.

The following day, attendees traveled to Tama-Plaza, where the city and Tokyu Corporation introduced the initiatives guiding the area's transit-oriented development and urban revitalization, before observing the waste incineration facilities at the Asahi Plant. A wrap-up session concluded the tour, which was accompanied by a presentation on Yokohama's Y-PORT project.
