
## Walking & Jogging MAP


### TOURIST INFORMATION

### BAY WALK YOKOHAMA

The waterfront path looking out across Port of Yokohama is an approximately 5km course (one way) for walking and jogging (6km if you go around Yamashita Park). It allows you to enjoy the pleasant sea breeze as you go through popular tourist sites along the scenic Yokohama Inner Harbor. Why not relish the beautiful sight of the port during the day or the breathtaking skyline at night?

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**1 RINKO PARK**  
 Enjoy the great view of Port of Yokohama from the largest park in Minato Mirai 21. The spacious lawn and the curved waterfront make it an ideal spot to relax and feel the breeze.

**2 PUKARISANBASHI PIER**  
 It is a floating terminal for regular liners and excursion boats that cruise around Port of Yokohama. The white tower with a green roof is an icon of the port.

**3 HAMMERHEAD CRANE**  
 The crane is a large-size cargo handling machine made in Britain more than 100 years ago. It is the symbol of Yokohama Hammerhead, a facility with a passenger ship terminal, hotel and commercial facilities.

**4 RED BRICK WAREHOUSE**  
 The bonded warehouse built at the beginning of the 20th century is now a commercial complex, but still has the traces of the past. It is one of the major tourist attractions in Yokohama accommodating various seasonal events.

**5 ZOU NO HANA PARK**  
 (Elephant's Nose Park) The park preserves the wharf built in 1859 along with the opening of the port of Yokohama. It was named after the shape of the breakwater which looks like an elephant's nose.

**6 OSANBASHI**  
 The pier has been the gateway to the sea since the opening of the port. It has been reconstructed multiple times before the current 7th terminal. The wooden-deck rooftop with lawn spaces is a popular spot to enjoy the port view.

**7 YAMASHITA PARK**  
 The park with the port view representing Yokohama was made in 1930 by filling the sea with the rubble from the Great Kanto Earthquake. Hikawamaru, the ship used for the Seattle line during and after the war, is preserved.
